

Worship Notes: The hymn All Glory, Laud, and Honor was composed around 820 A.D. by Theodulph of Orléans and was first used as a Palm Sunday processional hymn. Theodulph was born in either Spain or Italy and was a monk until King Charlemagne brought him to France in 781 and made him abbot of Fleury and bishop of Orléans. He was imprisoned for conspiring against King Louis the Pious.
