Scott was born in Elk Grove, Illinois and for much of her life she taught music in the Ladies' Seminary at Lyons, Iowa. She wrote the works in *The Royal Anthem Book* (1882), the first collection of anthems published by a woman. She died at Dubuque, Iowa.

The phrase "Open my eyes" is drawn from Psalm 119:18.
